JUDGE PAUL G. MAUGHAN



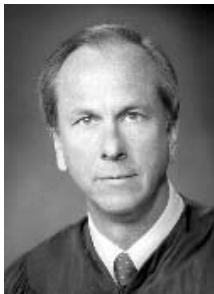
