**DR. KARI T. ELLINGSON** is the Associate Vice President for Student Development at the University of Utah. For ten years prior she was a psychologist at the University Counseling Center with a specialization in substance abuse prevention and treatment. She served as director for the last two years of that time. As an adjunct Associate Professor in Departments of Educational Psychology and Educational Leadership and Policy, she has taught a variety of graduate and undergraduate courses, most recently Assessment in Higher Education and Individual and Group Interventions and Introduction to Leadership. Prior to entering higher education, Dr. Ellingson held the position of Project Officer for the Reimbursable Development Programs within the Agency for International Development, U.S. Department of State. Dr. Ellingson has over fifty regional and national presentations and several publications, the most recent being a chapter in *Beginning your journey: A guide for new professionals in Student Affairs* (Amey, M.J. and Reesor, L.M, Eds, 2009). She has been actively involved with NASPA: Student Affairs Administrators in Higher Education for many years and currently serves on the National Board as Region V. Vice President.

Dr. Ellingson earned a Bachelors degree in English from the University of Virginia, a Masters in Counseling and Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She also keeps busy with two teenage (Millennial) children.

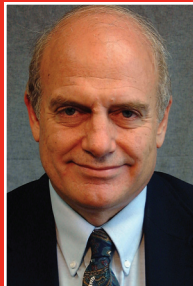

 Brigham Young University



DR. WARNER P. WOODWORTH is a Social Entrepreneur and Professor of Organizational Leadership and Strategy at Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah. He received a Ph.D. at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor and has been doing advocacy work and building partnerships with individuals, communities, government institutions, corporations, and NGOs around the globe. He and his collaborators have designed and implemented nearly fifty projects in 34 countries, raising millions annually in donations and investment capital, training hundreds of thousands of disadvantaged women, and growing their microentrepreneur base to over 8 million clients. He is a founder of Unitus, Enterprise Mentors, Help International and a number of other organizations.

Professor Woodworth is author of more than a hundred publications, ten books, and some 200-plus conference papers. He mentors dozens of students annually, many of whom have gone on to law or business management. Dr. Woodworth also works locally to assist and empower marginalized groups from his base in the Rocky Mountain region of Utah, especially within minority communities such as Hispanics and Native American tribes.

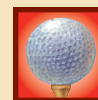
